

King County Democratic Central Committee (KCDCC)

Endorsement Procedures Approved 4/22/2008 For the 2008 Primary and General Election

A. General

1. The KCDCC or the KCDCC Executive Board may make endorsements on behalf of the KCDCC.
2. All members of the KCDCC Executive Board shall be given written notice at least ten days in advance of any meeting at which candidate endorsements may be made.
3. KCDCC Executive Board voting members as defined in the KCDCC Bylaws Article VI, Section 6.2 are eligible to vote on motions to endorse.
4. More than one candidate for the same office may be endorsed. A motion to endorse a particular candidate for a given office shall not exclude further motions to endorse other candidates for that same office.
5. Regular endorsements are considered after the close of candidate filing.
6. Early Endorsements may be made after a candidate has filed appropriate forms with the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission. Candidates challenging non Democratic incumbents may be considered for an early endorsement. Previously endorsed Democratic or nonpartisan incumbents may be considered for an early endorsement.

B. Criteria for Endorsement

1. To be eligible for endorsement, a candidate must file as a Democrat or in the case of nonpartisan races other than races for judicial positions, must identify themselves as a Democrat. Judicial candidates must show support of Democratic principles.
2. A candidate must complete the "2008 General Questionnaire" or the "2008 Judicial Questionnaire" and follow the submission procedure on the KCDCC website (www.kcdems.org) to be considered for endorsement. The candidates' responses to the questionnaire will be posted on the website.

C. Legislative Candidate endorsement

No KCDCC endorsement shall be made for any legislative district candidate prior to the Legislative District Organization considering endorsement of the position provided the Legislative District Organization is duly organized and functioning.

D. Requirements for Endorsement

1. At least two thirds majority vote of the Executive Board members present and voting (not counting abstentions) shall be required to endorse.
2. A candidate, candidates, or ballot issue position shall be considered for endorsement upon a motion from a KCDCC executive committee member.
 - a. Each candidate seeking the endorsement of the KCDCC or campaign staff member will be given two minutes to make a statement. Time will be allowed for questions and answers, one minute each – maximum of ten questions.
 - b. Voting members of the KCDCC executive committee may make a one minute statement for or against the motion to endorse with no more than three members speaking for or against in turn (i.e., F/A, F/A, F/A).

E. KCDCC Endorsement

1. Endorsed candidates shall receive a formal letter indicating they may use the KCDCC name and endorsement in any and all literature. The letter will include an enclosed form stating: "any PCO or membership list provided to you by KCDCC is for the duration of your campaign and may not be shared." The Chair will request signature of candidate on the attachment and further, request copy of signed form be returned by email or FAX.
2. Endorsed candidates names and contact information shall be posted on the KCDCC website (www.kcdems.org). Other resources may be made available to the endorsed candidates.

Pike Place Market Renovation Campaign

For over 100 years, Pike Place Market has been the heart and soul of downtown Seattle. Walking down red brick Pike Place in midsummer is far more exciting than walking down an ordinary street: vendors shout, grocery shoppers bustle, sightseers stopping to take it all in. But while the people of the Market are in as good shape as ever, its buildings need help.

The last major repairs of the Market buildings were performed 30 years ago, when Seattle residents rallied together and ran the first Save the Market Campaign. Use of the buildings in the Market went up dramatically after the original repairs, and the buildings are beginning to show it: leaking windows, roofs, and plumbing; minimal access for the disabled; outdated fire and electrical systems; and, most important, the buildings desperately need a seismic upgrade.

To afford this important investment, Mayor Greg Nickels has proposed a six-year levy totaling \$73 million for the November 2008 ballot. The levy will cost the average Seattle homeowner a mere \$37 per year from 2009 through 2014. The levy is the best way to ensure that the Market will be as alive as ever for Seattle's next generation.

So show your support for the Market! Other organizations, such as the Greater Seattle Chamber of Commerce, Allied Arts, the Downtown Seattle Association, and the Building Owners and Managers Association of Seattle (BOMA) have already endorsed the ballot initiative. Civic leaders, such as Mayor Nickels and former mayor Charlie Royer, have also strongly endorsed the levy.
